Galvanizing coordinated support and action around "missions"

2020 GEM priority actions (Mission: recovering education 2021)

- 1) Protect education finance, include allocations for equity-focussed learning recovery, skills development and (re-)enrolment campaigns; increase international aid
- 2) Safely reopen educational institutions, strengthening and restoring access to services (e.g. school meals, health, WASH, social protection)
- 3) Support all teachers and education personnel as frontline workers, ensuring their safety, well-being, decent working conditions and professional development (digital and pedagogical skills)
- 4) Invest in skills development for social and emotional well-being and inclusive recovery, decent work and enhanced employability and sustainable development
- 5) Narrow the digital divide in education and develop quality open educational resources
